
Metis stands at the frontier between research and action. An asserted and assumed position.


Acting in the territories

All are based on Metis engineering designed to facilitate spaces for creativity, expression and emotion. These projects transform all their stakeholders. Their knowledge, will and capacity for action are multiplied tenfold.

An artist, a development operator, and a local community come together in a specific region. United by a challenge they collectively acknowledge and that directly affects them, they commit to the process and co-create an ambitious artistic work.

This participatory process leads all participants to (re)connect to their sensitive part, to live a singular emotional experience.









CARTE BLANCHE **MOZAMBIQUE 2023**

The *Madala* elephant for biodiversity!

Carried out in the heart of the Niassa nature reserve in northern Mozambique, this initiative tackled the complex subject of poaching, human-wildlife conflicts and (re)connecting the local population to the challenges of conserving biodiversity through an emotional vector.

3 artists and over 50 local people have built a life-size elephant from old materials left over from poaching. 30 women trained in crochet made the skin. They named it "Madela Vaku Niassa".

The President of the Republic, impressed by this work of art, encouraged his country to continue its efforts to protect biodiversity.

The work is now on display in a museum in Maputo, where more than 5,000 children have already come to see it. It will keep on going...

CARTE BLANCHE TUNISIA 2022

The Little Prince: dreaming to take care of your environment and your neighborhood

The initiative mobilized a collective of Tunisian artists to restore hope to the young people of a vulnerable neighborhood in the city of Jendouba, a victim of the exodus of its population to more attractive urban centers.

The universal power of Saint-Exupéry's novel *The Little Prince* resonated in the neighborhood's cultural center for 3 months: the collective ran a series of educational and creative workshops with and for young people around the notions of dreams, travel and tolerance.

60 children took part and created their own works. Artists inspired by local reality also produced works. Together they presented their final productions to over 200 people. On the strength of this experience, the artists in turn produced new works and returned to to present them to local residents.

Pride, wonder, peace, joy, freedom to act and create, self-confidence... these are the words reported by the participants.



CARTE BLANCHE BRAZIL 2022

Proud producers of acai, these women and their entourage share their challenges via photography

The economic role of women is often not very visible in Brazil. The initiative by women ribeirinhas producers of acai in the state of Para have highlighted their work and their place in Paraense society, thanks to the support of the Institute for Environmental Research of Amazonia (IPAM), photographer Ana Mendès and the Fotoativa collective.

The initiative, co-constructed with all these players, consisted of:

- The production of a photo report reporting the daily lives, identities and responsibilities of these women.
- · Fotoativa led several days of creative workshops with local communities, including children, around the issues of their identity and social status at within Paraense society.
- The organization of local and national exhibitions to share these participative experiences.

Over 120 people were involved - including more than 60 women and 30 children.

The people around them contributed to and benefited from the project.

In addition to its project-based approach, the Fonds Metis aims to create the conditions to disseminate and amplify the power of the Arts & Développement encounter, so that other players can make it their own and apply it in turn. A necessary step towards greater impact.

METIS MOBILITY

The "Metis Mobility" program is unique: it promotes the sharing of South-South experiences between artists who have participated in a Metis initiative.

In 2023, 3 grants were awarded. They enabled 6 artists to meet: Nigeria and Mexico, Tunisia and Peru, India and Togo.

These encounters are a source of mutual learning. They strengthen the artists' commitments, their networks and their skills.

MOBILITY TOGO / INDIA 2023

Fight against plastic pollution: two Metis artists share and reinforce their societal commitment

In 2023, Indian artist Manveer Gautam -Plasticvilla (Carte blanche 2021) traveled to meet Togolese artist Tesprit (Carte blanche 2022) in his native country.

Through their committed and collaborative art, both are fighting against plastic pollution in their respective countries.

Together with the inhabitants of a neighborhood in Lomé, they have co-created artworks made from locally collected waste. These astonishing and original works were exhibited in the garden of the Lomé Town Hall.

A sensitive intercultural experience to reinforce company's commitment against plastic pollution.


The Metis Lab

The place of emotions in our society, their role, and the power of the arts to connect us and nourish our emotions are just some of the reflective projects currently ongoing. The Metis Lab is developing a dynamic of reflection, capitalization and debate. Its ambition is to lead an ecosystem of actors to think, question and promote the Arts & Development link.

DEFINING AN INSIGHTFUL THEORY OF CHANGE

Metis has developed a specific project engineering approach designed to enable impact. This engineering was the subject of in-depth reflection carried out with a consultancy specializing in evaluation. This work led to the definition of our theory of change. It is implemented in the local areas by the local people involved. It is adapted to the challenges and contexts they face.

EXPERIMENTATION IMPACT MEASUREMENT

Methodological reflection and testing have been carried out with experts in impact assessment to better understand the impacts of our projects.


Metis also provides visual and audio documentation of all projects financed. Qualitative surveys are conducted annually with each of our partners.

CREATION OF A COALITION OF BANKS "CULTURE, ARTS & DEVELOPMENT"

Thanks to its network, Metis has initiated the creation of an Arts & Development coalition between 7 public development banks. The coalition aims to reinforce knowledge of the potential of culture and the arts in relation to development issues and to promote dedicated operations.

LAUNCH OF 1st STUDY ARTS & DEVELOPMENT

A concise inventory of actions implemented by a dozen development banks in connection with arts and culture topics has been initiated. The study shows the diversity and richness of existing approaches while underlining the importance of deepening this knowledge by widening the number of players analyzed.







METIS, THE GREEK GODDESS OF WISDOM

Nestled within Zeus, who swallowed her, Metis subtly contributes to his unparalleled power. As the mother of Athena, goddess of wisdom, and a faithful advisor to Ulysses (or "the discreet source of Ulysses' successes"), she is a goddess with many faces.
